

DR. BREEDA MCGRATH

Breeda McGrath is an Associate Campus Dean for Online programs. She previously served as the Online Dean of Academic Affairs, Department Chair of the International Psychology Online, and Dean of Academic Affairs at the Chicago campus. Dr. McGrath joined The Chicago School in 2007. She earned her doctoral and master's degrees in school

psychology at Loyola University Chicago. As a Licensed Clinical Psychologist and Nationally Certified School Psychologist, Dr. McGrath is active in a number of APA Divisions (Peace Psychology, International Psychology) and is an APA CRSPPP Commissioner. She is a certified trainer in the NASP School Crisis Prevention and Intervention Training Curriculum (PREPaRE) and previously worked as a psychologist in Illinois public schools. She provides training and consultation for the Young Center of Immigrant Children's Rights and has established international collaborations Indonesia, Senegal, India, and Greece.

Dr. McGrath's expertise in school psychology includes child development, social-emotional learning, trauma-informed care, educational disabilities, legal issues, and training. In clinical psychology and mental health, she specializes in anxiety, mood disorders, self-injury, cognitive behavioral therapy, cross-cultural considerations, assessment, and psychological evaluation. Her experience in schools includes academic interventions, cognitive assessment, bullying, school violence, school supervision, school law and ethics, systems change, and international school psychology. Her expertise also includes bipolar disorder, anxiety, depression, dysthymia, PTSD/trauma, crisis intervention, diversity issues, immigration, and identity development.



PROF. DR. STEVEN KRAUSS

Prof. Dr. Steven Krauss (@ Abd. Lateef) is a Professor in the Department of Professional Development and Continuing Education, Faculty of Educational Studies, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM). He has also served as the Deputy Director of the Institute for Social Science Studies (IPSAS), UPM, since 2022. Dr. Krauss earned his Ph.D. in Youth Studies from Universiti Putra Malaysia in 2005. He has worked in the field of positive youth development since the mid-1990's, where he started out as a Program Assistant under Dr. Karen

Pittman of the Center for Youth Development and Policy Research in Washington, D.C., USA.

His research primarily adopts a developmental systems perspective, focusing on understanding the factors that contribute to positive youth development and thriving in various practice settings. In particular, his work delves into the significance of developmental relationships between young individuals and adults, investigating how these relationships foster empowerment, connection, and purpose among youth from diverse backgrounds. Dr. Krauss has led numerous studies that explore the role of developmental relationships, specifically through youth-adult partnerships, within youth associations, schools, and community-based youth development programs in both local and international contexts. Moreover, he has made notable contributions to the field of Muslim religion and spirituality as influential factors in enhancing youth thriving. Notably, he co-authored one of the pioneering indigenous measures of Islamic religiosity.

In addition to his research endeavors, Dr. Krauss' outreach work has included technical support, training and consultancy with an array of local and international youth-serving organizations including the Ministry of Youth and Sports Malaysia. He is most proud of his role as Ambassador (Duta) for Adab Youth Garage, with whom he has collaborated with since 2018.

Dr. Krauss currently holds the position of Associate Editor for the Journal of Adolescent Research and Frontiers in Psychology, demonstrating his expertise and leadership in his field. His research findings have been published in reputable journals such as the Journal of Youth and Adolescence, Youth & Society, the Journal of Adolescent Research, and the Journal of Applied Developmental Psychology, among others.



DR. JUFITRI BIN JOHA

Jufitri bin Joha is the Former President of Majlis Belia Malaysia (MBM), Chairman of Benevolent Malaysia and Deputy Chairman of Global Peace Mission (GPM) Malaysia. In addition, he was active in promoting professional youth employment until he was appointed a Board Member of the Commonwealth Alliance of Youth Workers Associations (CAYWA).

Obtained a Bachelor of Law at the International Islamic University (UIA) Malaysia in 2003 before pursuing his Master of Youth and Community Work at Durham University, United Kingdom (UK) in 2010 under the British Government's Chevening Scholarship. He has just completed his PhD in Youth Studies at the Institute of Social Science Studies (IPSAS) of Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM).

He was a Board Member of the International Youth Centre (IYC) Kuala Lumpur and the Malaysian Institute of Youth Development Research (IYRES). He was also appointed as President of the Global Coalition of Youth and Sports for Palestine (GCYSP) in addition to being appointed as a Member of the SPRM Corruption Negotiation and Prevention Panel (PPPR), Member of the Council of St. John Ambulance Malaysia and Vice President of Africa Asia Youth Government (AAYG).

YOUTH ICON PANELISTS BIOGRAPHY



DR. MOHD SIRHAJWAN BIN IDEK

Dr. Sirhajwan Idek is an English language teacher at Keningau Vocational College, Sabah. He earned his bachelor's degree, master's degree, and PhD from Universiti Teknologi Mara Shah Alam. He was the 2017 National Teacher Icon and 2022 National Youth Icon. He, along with his colleagues, has won the 2022 GoAbroad Innovation Award in Innovative Teach Abroad Program Category, 2021 Simon Greenall Award and 2020 YSEALI Seed for the Future. His research on visual literacy earned him the ISTE Literacy Innovation Award in 2019 and he received a grant worth of AUD 10,000 for winning the 2018 SEAMEO-Australia Education Link Award through his ethnic tales' project.

In 2017, he became the first Asian to win Innovation and Entrepreneurship Excellence in Teaching Award in Paris and he was also the top 50 finalist for Global Teacher Prize in the same year. He has conducted over 300 webinars, workshops, and talks on innovations and research across Malaysia and in other regions (Southeast Asia, China & MENA). In the effort to revive arts and folklore, he has trained his students in performing, literary and visual arts which resulted in almost 300 students whose artistic works have earned prizes in online art festivals and talent competitions while some of their visual and literacy pieces were published in magazines.

In 2022, he initiated a massive internationalization programme comprising virtual cultural exchange classes that has impacted over 1500 students and teachers in the country. Dr. Sirhajwan is the president of HIVE and the former head of Malaysian OPEN Alumni in which both teacher associations have been conducting continuing professional development programmes for Malaysian teachers.
